- Do your best.
- This is a good predictor of how well you will do on the actual SAT

Spring Semester

- Do your best on End-of-Course exams (EOCs).
- Prepare for your semester exams

Signing up for courses for next fall

- Talk to your counselor and teachers about taking AP, Dual Credit, or Dual Enrollment courses. This way, you can maximize earning college credit while in high school.
- Check your progress towards earning graduation credits.
- Revise and update your four year plan in TEAMS and make sure you are completing needed classes.

Learn about colleges

- Visit colleges online, take virtual tours, visit nearby campuses
- Niche, College Board Big Future, and Own Your Own Future are great college search engines in addition to using Naviance College SuperMatch within the AISD portal.

Stay focused

- Make sure to do your best.
- Your GPA (which drives your class rank) is used when you apply to college. It is calculate for ALL coursework taken from 9th through 11th grade.
